

ICEWORKS SKATING COMPLEX PLAN OF ACTION FOR POSITIVE CORONAVIRUS CASE

At IceWorks Skating Complex, the health and safety of all customers, visitors, and staff has always been and will remain our top priority. We understand that it is possible that one of our players, figure skaters, coaches, or staff members may become infected with coronavirus. Below, please find our plan of action if a positive case of coronavirus does occur in our facility:

We encourage all persons entering our facility to self-monitor for coronavirus symptoms. If you have two or more of these symptoms, we encourage all customers and visitors to our facility to stay home. If symptoms persist, you should follow all CDC and state/local guidance on getting tested for coronavirus. If you are an IceWorks staff member, you need to notify your immediate supervisor of any symptoms and we will proceed to next steps in accordance with the CDC and the Pennsylvania Department of Health. These symptoms may include:

- 1. Fever or chills
- 2. Cough
- 3. Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- 4. Fatigue
- 5. Muscle or body aches
- 6. Headache
- 7. New loss of taste or smell
- 8. Sore throat
- 9. Congestion or runny nose
- 10. Nausea or vomiting
- 11. Diarrhea

This list of symptoms may be updated to reflect any new information put forth by the CDC or the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

#1 Positive Covid-19 PCR Test with Symptoms

- You may return to our facility 10 days since symptoms first appeared, have an improvement of symptoms by the tenth day, and if you have exhibited a period of 24 hours without a fever.
- In addition to the above requirements, you must present proof of negative covid-19 PCR test to the general manager upon return to our facility.

#2 Positive Covid-19 PCR Test without Symptoms

- You may return to our facility 10 days after PCR test was collected. If symptoms develop during those 10 days, follow the return guidance outlined in #1
- In addition to the above requirements, you must present proof of negative covid-19 PCR test to the <u>general manager</u> upon return to our facility.

#3 Direct Contact with Positive Covid-19 Person and you Exhibit Symptoms

- Direct contact is defined as being within 6 feet of someone for a period of time that is 15 minutes or longer. You are <u>required</u> to be tested for Covid-19. Individuals awaiting test results should not return to our facility.
 - o If test result is negative, you may return to our facility 14 days after last exposure to the person with Covid-19 and if symptoms are resolved.
 - $\circ~$ If test result is positive, follow the return policy outlined in #1

#4 Direct Contact with Positive Covid-19 Person and you do not Exhibit Symptoms

- You may return to our facility 14 days after the date of last exposure to the person with Covid-19.
 - o If symptoms develop during 14 days, follow our return guidance outlined in #3
- In addition to the above requirements, you must present proof of negative covid-19 PCR test to the general manager upon return to our facility.

Exception: Anyone who has developed Covid-19 illness within the previous 3 months AND has recovered AND remains without Covid-19 symptoms may return to our facility.
